



## BTC + XRP Combined Operating Guide

This guide turns the bundle into one operating policy. Its job is to keep BTC as the destination asset, keep XRP capped and useful, and make reserve / transfer behavior explicit before the stressful weeks arrive.

### 1. Role separation

Sleeve	Default role	Default behavior
BTC	Reserve core and destination asset	Keep its own weekly budget and engine logic intact. Do not raid it midweek to chase XRP.
XRP	Capped asymmetry sleeve	Use the cycle engine and Weekly Plan to participate, stage defense, and build reserve cash under written rules.
Reserve cash	Shock absorber and transfer pool	Hold realized XRP trim cash by default and only transfer on the written review window.

### 2. Public default capital map

BTC-heavy remains the clean public starting point: 70% to 85% BTC and 15% to 30% XRP, with 80% / 20% as the simplest default when no separate policy exists. Keep XRP at or below 25% of total crypto capital unless a separate written policy explicitly allows more.

#### 3. Custody baseline

BTC is the destination reserve asset. Once the withdrawal path is verified, move the long-term BTC core into cold storage rather than leaving the reserve core parked on an exchange.

Keep only the XRP needed for near-term execution, reserve handling, or known transfer windows on exchange. The clean default is an open-source hardware wallet plus a durable offline recovery backup, with one small test withdrawal completed before larger transfers.

#### 4. Weekly rhythm

- Weekly close: review BTC on 1W and read the current action and amount.
- Weekly close: review XRP on BITSTAMP:XRPUSD 1W and log the Week Plan action and capital state.

- Same night: update the Companion Tracker and Weekly Strategy Tracker while the weekly close is still fresh.
- Midweek: observe, do not rewrite the policy.

#### 5. Transfer windows and simplify rules

Move XRP trim cash toward BTC only on the written monthly transfer window or after the final cycle-exit window. Simplify to BTC-only if the XRP sleeve becomes emotionally heavy, execution becomes inconsistent, or the operator starts rewriting the ladder mid-cycle.

#### 6. Best fit

Best fit: BTC-first buyers who want the XRP sleeve to remain subordinate to the reserve-core objective and who want one written map for sleeve caps, reserve handling, and transfer behavior. Not for traders who plan to rotate impulsively between assets during the week.

The bundle should feel calmer than running two separate tools. If it is increasing discretion, simplify.
