

BTC Operating System Alert Setup Card

Version v1.0.6

The rule that matters most

Create alerts on the supported **1W BTC chart** and choose one alert path you will actually follow. The cleanest off-chart path is one **Any alert() function call** alert on **Once Per Bar Close**; reminder-only named alerts are still valid if you prefer manual dashboard checks.

Correct triggers

Condition / path	Trigger	Why
Any alert() function call	Once Per Bar Close	Leanest v1.0.6 workflow. Delivers the confirmed weekly HOLD / BUY / TRIM guidance and current amount when applicable, plus the Integrity line.
Weekly Update	Once Per Bar Close	Reminder-only weekly review alert if you prefer the dashboard-check workflow.
Major Cycle Event	Once Per Bar Close	Rare serious review weeks that can align with major top or bottom conditions forming. Treat it as a high-priority review alert, not as auto-execution.

Recommended alert paths

Choose one live path first

Path A: one **Any alert() function call** alert if you want the exact weekly guidance and amount pushed off-chart. Path B: **Weekly Update**, plus optional **Major Cycle Event**, if you prefer reminder-only alerts and a manual dashboard review. Path C: no alerts if you reliably review the dashboard yourself after every confirmed 1W close.

Naming convention

- If you use the exact-message path, keep the name literal: **BTC Weekly Guidance Email 1W**.
- If you keep reminder alerts, use **BTC Weekly Update 1W** and **BTC Major Cycle Event 1W**.
- If you maintain multiple sleeves or accounts, include the sleeve name in the alert title. If you automate, also include the mode and Risk level for easier later debugging.

Common mistakes

- Creating the alert on a non-1W chart, or on a chart basis outside the intended BTC workflow.
- Assuming the alert updates after you change settings. TradingView alerts keep using the settings that existed when the alert was created.
- Treating **Major Cycle Event** as an order instruction instead of a review instruction.
- Running both reminder paths and the exact-message path when you only wanted one weekly notification route.
- Sending webhooks or bridges live before you have sandboxed the full route with paper or test capital.

Manual versus automation

Path	Best for	Watch-out
Manual weekly review	Beginners and users who want the calmest workflow.	Requires you to actually check the dashboard after the confirmed weekly close.
Exact-message email / webhook path	Users who want ACTION and the current amount sent off-chart.	Still requires settings discipline, testing, and clear downstream risk limits.
Reminder-only named alerts	Users who want cadence without extra automation.	Still review the dashboard; the reminder is not the whole decision.

Best default in one sentence

Run the workflow on the supported 1W BTC chart, keep one alert path live only if it helps you stay consistent, and make the real decision from ACTION plus amount on the confirmed weekly close.
